Occupy Los Angeles News observed yesterday's Los Angeles Times' lead editorial "Ending the occupation." LA Times wrote begrudgingly that Occupy LA is "wearing out their welcome." The editorial went on to hint OLA may be damaging fig trees and also chastised the movement's "lack of leadership or central organization." The paper also wrote "it's hard to negotiate with a headless group united only by its resentment toward bankers, corporations, Congress, the media and others in positions of power—including the police." Specifically the editors complained that there is no OLA leader that can "agree on who will

The Occupy LA movement sounded like an inconvenience to the LA Times. The paper said OLA "look more like a Hooverville than a demonstration." 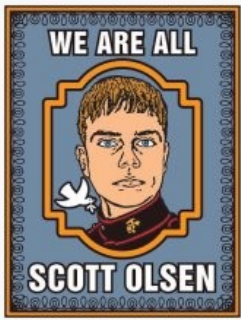
